2. STATUS UPDATE FOR THE WATER AND WASTEWATER COST OF SERVICE STUDY

Public Works Director Shana Epstein gave a presentation on the proposed water and wastewater rates, including for water, fund balance projections, water tier adjustments, proposed water quantity rates and service charges, and comparisons with other agencies. For wastewater, the presentation covered the fund balance, return to sewer factors, single-family irrigation customer analysis, proposed wastewater rates, various customer bills with phase in, wastewater rates phased-in, and comparisons with other agencies. Combined bill impacts for all customer classes were also presented. Staff is not asking for a revenue increase in wastewater. The proposed wastewater cost of service rates would see single and multi-family bi-monthly fixed service charges decrease with the introduction of a flow-based quantity charge. Staff recommended that the Liaison review and provide direction on the proposed rate changes and policy recommendations.

The liaison asked about fluctuations in water bills, the effect of federal grants on the water fund balance, and the accounting behind the proposals. After discussion, the liaison approved moving forward the proposed water and wastewater rates to the full City Council for approval to notify the community following Proposition 218 guidelines. The plan is to present to the City Council at a study session in the summer, with a public hearing in October. Community outreach will be conducted in August and September. The schedule will be shared once finalized. If approved by the City Council, adjusted wastewater rates and the adjusted water reliability charge would become effective January 1, 2024, and adjusted water rates would become effective January 1, 2025.
