Drought Severity


- ◆ 2020 and 2021 least amount of rainfall on record
- Snowpack has already melted
- Lake Mead record low








California Drought Map








<u>Snowpack</u>



- April $1^{st} = 2.5''$ (normal = 5')
- April 1st = 38%(Dec '21 = 202%)
- Forecast is a dry2023

Drought Background

- ◆ August 21, 2021 Lake Mead Water shortage declared
- October 19, 2021
 Gov. Newsom declared
 California drought

Drought Background

- ♦ BH Drought Declaration Adopted by City Council on 2/8/22
- ♦ Water Conservation Stage C (Municipal Code 9-4-305 & Reso17-R-13135)

- Permanent Water Restrictions (Municipal Code 9-4-201)
- ♠ Enhanced Enforcement of Water Waste (Municipal Code 1-3-101)







- March 28, 2022 Growing severity, Gov Newsom EO N-7-22
 - ♠ Reduce summertime use
 - **♦** SWRCB to Consider
 - ♦ Water suppliers conserve 20% w/ voluntary reduction to 30%
 - SWRCB potential ban of commercial "non-functional turf"







- ♠ April 20, 2022 SCWCB issued Draft Regulations:
 - Outreach campaign for water conservation.
 - No more than 2 days per week watering
 - No potable water for commercial "non-functional turf"







- ◆ April 26, 2022 MWD declared Water Shortage Emergency for SWP customers:
 - ◆ 1 day per week watering or Water Allocation
 - ◆ Face finds up to \$2000/AF of H20
 - ♦ Starting June 1, 2022

Drought Update



- - 2 day per week watering
 - down from 3 days
 - Odd & even address watering days
 - ♦ 8 minutes per station (15 for efficient sprinkler heads)







- ♦ The SWRCB regulations timeline:
 - Mid-May 2022: New Regulations posted for public comment
 - May 24, 2022: Board consider adoption of emergency regulations

- BH Staff will wait for SWRCB updates
- Updates and changes will be presented to PW Commission June 9th
- ◆ Comments and actions will be presented to City Council June 14th
- ◆ For now, outdoor watering will stay at 2 days a week (as it has been)

STAGE C water conservation restrictions are now in effect.

20% water reduction

- **♦** Increased Education
 - ✓ Conservation messages
 - ✓ Flyers and audits
- **♦** Enforcement Actions:
 - ✓ Water Leaks
 - ✓ Excessive Irrigation
 - ✓ Water Run Off





Drought Declaration Actions

- Elevator and wall clings
- **♦** Truck signs
- Burton Way signs
- **♦** Fountain signs
- Mailer to commercial customers
- Postcard to residential customers
- Outreach at events
